**This week:** We had a double whammy of quizzes with one on Wednesday AND Friday. The first was about last week's material about elements and the periodic table, and the second was specifically about elements, knowing chemical symbols and whether it is a metal, non-metal or gas. We also started a real world application by learning about the elements that are used in plastic,


