Scholastic: We completed part one (5.1 and 5.2) and also took quiz 1 and started with part 2 unit 5 (5.3, 5.4, 5.5)

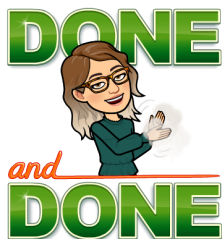
Honors: We completed unit 6 part 1 and next week we will start with unit 6 part 2.

comprehension skills to solve riddles and puzzles to escape. The winning teams got a Free Friday assignment!!

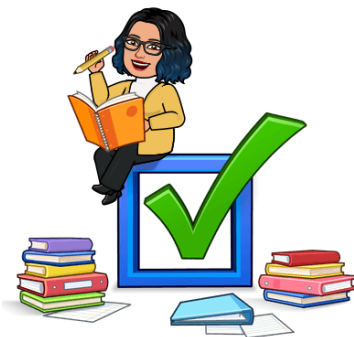
Week 30 we will be beginning the new book and starting a unit on the Hero's Journey.
