As a guardian, you can get email summaries about your student's activity in Classroom. Email summaries do not include grades. For grades, ask your student or contact the teacher.

In email summaries, you can review:

- Missing work—Work not turned in when the summary was sent.
- Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails).
- Class activities—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers

I will also be able to quickly email you from there to let you know of any important messages in regards to a specific assignment.

Mrs. Rapp will be returning. YAY!!!!

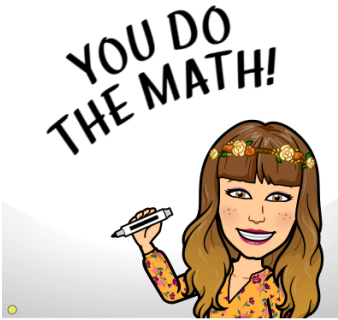

Scholastic: We have completed unit 2. We will start with unit 3 .

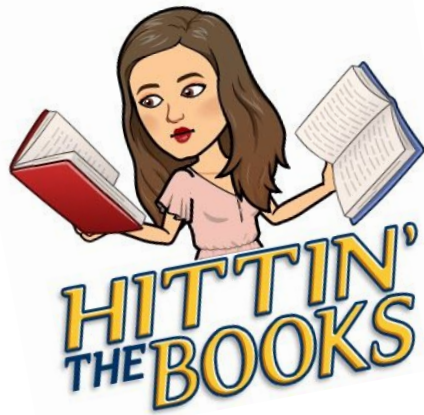
Honors: We completed unit 3 part 1 and will do the review and will have quiz 3.1 , and the continue with the unit 3 part 2.

Language Arts with Mrs. Cerezo

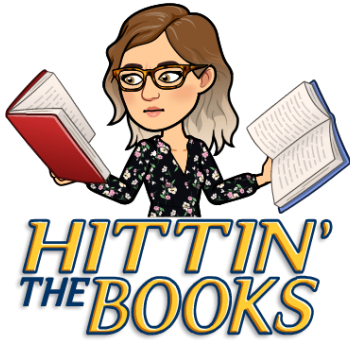
This was a short week and so we used this week to review what we have learned so far about the Cold War-- using our book as the model.
